

located on South Main Street just south of Nazareth Lutheran Church and the Highway 58 overpass. The park is a fenced in, off-leash exercise facility for dogs.

It provides 3 acres of hilly terrain, dog waste bags and disposal tank, a shelter, picnic tables and parking lot for your use. A dog water fountain and restrooms are available during warm weather months. Paw Park provides a space where dogs can exercise and socialize with other dogs. It offers a great opportunity to allow your dogs to run, play and just be a dog!

Things to consider before you visit:

- Has your dog been around other dogs much? If not, it may be best to bring him during a slow time at first. Socialization is a process.
- ♦ Toys are allowed but expect to share. If you believe your dog will guard his favorite toy from other dogs, please leave the toy at home.

Tennis balls are plentiful at Paw Park for dogs not interested in interacting.



◆ Unleash! Dogs on leashes can feel trapped and defensive and may act up. The leash can also present a hazard to other park users. If you must leave a leash on, please let it drag behind the dog.





- ⇒ Do not leave your dog in the park unattended.
- ⇒ If your dog poops, you must scoop. Biodegradable bags and pooper scoopers are provided. Place waste in the disposal, not trash receptacles.
- ⇒ Bring no more than 2 dogs per person, carry a leash for each dog at all times.
- Dogs must be licensed, vaccinated and wearing current tags to use Paw Park. The Paw Park permit should be displayed on the dog or be in possession of the owner.
- ⇒ Remove dogs at the first sign of aggression.
- Children must be six years of age or older and should be under close supervision at all time. Young children can be injured by running dogs and may not have the skills to deal with strange dogs.

Prohibited at Paw Park:

- Dogs in heat, can cause males to act aggressively even after the female has left the park. Please keep your female home even if the park is empty.
- No Puppies under 4 months of age.
- Prong or spike collars or electronic collars are not recommended. Flat buckle collars are best at Paw Park.
- No food, bones and rawhides.
