Inspired by Georgia O’Keeffe’s musings from her first views of the world from an airplane window, this exhibition features artists whose works play with technology to present familiar subjects from new perspectives. In many instances, new technologies not only inform the way the work is produced, but also the way viewers encounter it. To quote O’Keeffe, “It is breathtaking as one rises up over the world one has been living in—looking out at—and look(ing) down at it stretching away and away...it is very handsome way off into the level distance, fantastically handsome—like marvelous rug patterns or maybe Abstract Paintings.” (*Georgia O’Keeffe: Art & Letters*, 1987)

Students who take four years of arts and music classes average almost 100 points better on their SAT scores than students with only a half-year or less.
